Publishing DATA ONLY (peer-reviewed, citable journals accepting data-only publications)

- 🌱 **Earth System Science Data Journal** (www.earth-system-science-data.net) – DOI referenced, peer-reviewed open access journal for data-only papers (Copernicus , EGU journals publisher). CNRS-INSU first authors (including post-graduates) can publish for FREE (subject to conditions)
- 🌱 **Ecological Archives** (www.esapubs.org/archive/archive_D.htm) – no DOI, but peer-reviewed open access journal (\$70 per page). May accept data publications (electronic version only) that are both peer-reviewed and citable entities (\$250 for 10Mb data)

- 🍷 **EGU & CNRS-INSU** - Associated lab members (including post-graduates) publishing in any EGU (Copernicus Publishing) journals are reimbursed at 100% (subject to conditions).
- 🍷 **PLoS Biology & PLoS ONE** - grants full or partial publication-charge waivers to any author who requests them (<http://biology.plosjournals.org/perlserv/?request=index-html&issn=1545-7885>).
- 🍷 **German Research Foundation DFG** – Deutsche Forschungsgemeinschaft supports publication charges with €750 per year. This support can also be accumulated over the 3 years period of funding.
